Have you ever thought about what was here before Montgomery County was formed? Who lived here? And, what remains as evidence of these prior time periods?

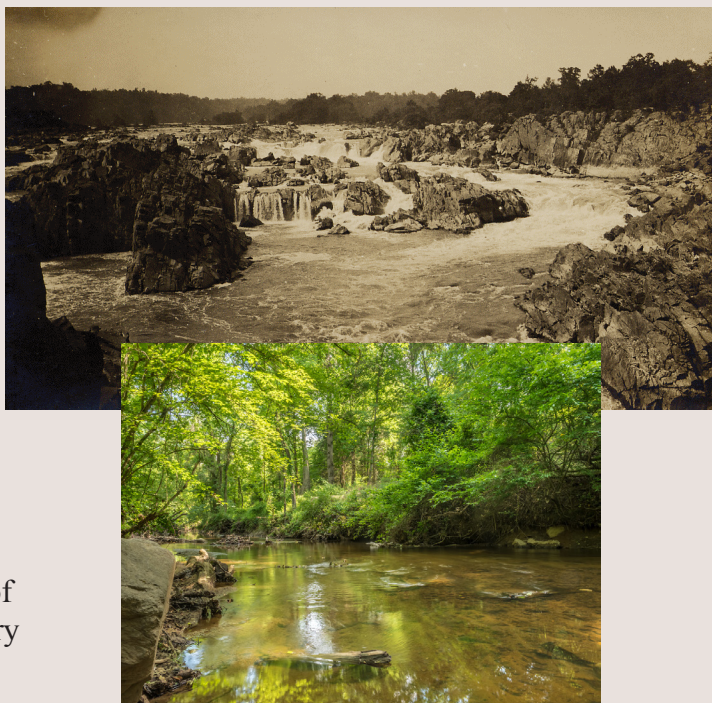
Join us for a special program to learn about the history of this area. Enjoy a fascinating look at our past, which will help bring perspective to our place in the history of this area.
